



Since 2018, Tennessee has added fewer than one new home for every three new jobs.



Total Employment and Housing (millions)



- Salary for Childcare Worker


Housing Costs vs. Average Wages (in thousands)

Expanding the Housing Toolbox

HB 2623/SB 2496

In 2018, the General Assembly prohibited local governments to use zoning or planning regulations to incentivize affordable housing, even through a voluntary program.

Proposed bill would repeal prohibition for all municipalities.

Sponsored by Senator Gardenhire (Chattanooga) and Representative Carr (Sevierville).

Passed Senate (30-1); on House Local Government Committee calendar March 26.

Tennessee Code Annotated

...so long as no power or authority granted to the local government unit to regulate zoning or land use planning is used to incentivize or leverage a person to develop, build, sell, or rent housing at below market value...

- § 66-35-102(b)(2)
